## Invitation

It is my pleasure to invite you to participate in the 2019 US National Hot Air Balloon Championship in Scottsbluff, Nebraska. The Balloon Federation of America has licensed the Old West Balloon Fest as the organizer for the 2019-2021 championships. A prize fund of \$20,000 is guaranteed along with a \$200 travel stipend to be paid in cash or gift/gas cards. The competitive event officially starts with on-site pilot registration and the mandatory General Briefing on Sunday, August 11. The organizer and HACD are offering support for two formal training flights to introduce the use of the FAI logger that will be used in this year's competition - Saturday and Sunday, August 10-11. The last competitive flight is scheduled for Saturday morning followed by a mandatory evening glow that will be the final flight operation of the Championship. The closing ceremony, awards and brunch is scheduled for Sunday morning August 18 allowing all participants to hit the road early for the return home.

The organizer is providing a complimentary hotel room for pilots with check in starting Sunday, August 11 and check out Sunday, August 18. Pilots wishing to arrive early may do so at their own expense and may reserve space once acceptance is confirmed and hotel information is provided. Once you have been accepted in the Championship you will be sent an acceptance confirmation along with your hotel contact information. Propane will be available on the mornings of August 10-11 for pilots arriving early and wishing to fly practice flights. Pilots will be charged a flat fee of \$40 for each fill on these dates. Arrive full; leave full. A tentative schedule of events is enclosed.

The Championship is open to qualifying US BFA/HACD member pilots who are in good standing. The selection process for the available spots is fully explained in the *BFA Competition Rules, Regulations, Policies and Procedures*. Pilots registering are expected to remain and participate for the entire duration of the event as required by the HACD Code of Conduct explained in Appendix A. With the exception of family emergencies, medical situations and other obvious events outside of the pilot's control, early departure from the event carries financial penalties and may include, regardless of NEL standing, DQ from State, Regional, National and International competition for the next year. Specifics of these regulations are contained in Appendix A and E Section VI. For your convenience, use this link to the BFA web site to get to the necessary information: HACD Rules – 2019.

#### Background

The Championship will introduce the use of the FAI logger in order to better align our Championship with the capabilities afforded us with this technology. The BFA Declaration App may or may not be used in conjunction with the FAI logger. As those decisions are made you will be informed. You are encouraged to familiarize yourself with all rules and policies involving the use of GPS loggers and the need to equip yourself with a backup GPS that meets the requirements of the rules. On line tutorials and information regarding the FAI loggers are available using these links: Interactive FAI Logger Tutorial, Balloon Competition Loggers

It is the intent of the HACD to post educational videos to the BFA/HACD web site prior to the event and we encourage you to take advantage of them. Topics being considered include: FAI logger, highlights of 2019 rule changes, scoring area definitions and examples, new task sheet layout and an electronic task tutorial.

Old West Balloon Fest and I are confident that this year's Championship will be well attended and a challenging exciting experience for both seasoned competitors and those new to the US Nationals. This summer's event will serve as your last opportunity to qualify for the 2020 World Hot Air Balloon Championships in Murska Sobota, Slovenija. It will also serve as one of the qualifying events, along with the US Women's Nationals, for the 2020 Women's and Junior World Championship.

#### Application Deadline - April 1, 2019

Participation in this year's event is limited to a maximum of fifty (50) competitors qualifying through the National Eligibility System plus those pilots qualifying under an organizer exemption as defined in the **BFA Competition Rules, Regulations, Policies and Procedures,** Appendix E, Section VI (b). We encourage you to submit your application early. We will be using the guidelines for acceptance based on the criteria described above and you will be notified by email of your acceptance no later than April 15 – **all applications (complete with bio and entry fee) must be received in the BFA Office on or before April 1, 2019**. You can mail your application or complete the attached forms, scan and email it to the BFA office.

## Women and Junior Competitors

The Organizer has generously provided for organizer exemptions for women and juniors desiring to use the US Nationals as a qualifier for their possible participation in International competition. Women and juniors not otherwise qualifying in the top fifty spots will be provided a spot in the US Nationals if it is your intention to use the event to qualify for participation in an upcoming World Championship. This is a unique opportunity and hopefully many will take advantage. It's important to note that these exemptions in no way impact the normal top fifty selection process. Women and juniors desiring to compete Internationally also need to be aware of new policies regarding US National experience requirements taking effect for International competition qualification starting in 2022.

#### Acceptance

Your application will not be considered complete until we receive your completed application form, digital (JPG) photo of your balloon and yourself (head shot only), \$200 entry fee (you can use BFA web site BFA Store) payable to the BFA and a completed balloon-related biography. The US National pilot list will be posted on the BFA website no later than April 15, 2019. A waiting list will be maintained for all applications received beyond the fifty qualifying slots available. Plans often change and last minute slots may be available. Even if your position in the 2018 National Eligibility System is well below the top fifty, you are encouraged to apply if you have an interest in competing. All women and juniors desiring to use this Championship as a qualifier for your respective World Championship are especially encouraged to register. Under no circumstances will pilot entries be filled from the waiting list after August 1, 2019. We ask that you submit your application only when all requested information is complete.

## Insurance

The Organizer and the BFA/HACD require that each participating pilot name the sponsoring organizations, venues and others directly involved in the organization and sponsoring of this event as additionally insured on their balloon insurance policy. We have reviewed this requirement with Aviation Insurance Resources and RPS/IMC Balloon Insurance agencies and have been assured by those agencies that they have no issues with this requirement.

We will provide a list of entities requiring additionally insured certificates that you will have to authorize. Additionally insureds will likely include: Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Trail Foundation and Scotts Bluff County.

## On-site Registration

A Preliminary Registration will be available Saturday morning before the first official practice flight and afternoon at the Gering Civic Center for those interested in practice flights before formal registration. The FAA Waiver, maps and area information will be available at this time.

Pilot Registration for all pilots will be held on Sunday, August 11 from 1:00 – 4:00 PM at the Gering Civic Center. All pilot packs, tickets, maps, banners, etc. will be distributed at that time. FAA staff from the Lincoln, Nebraska FSDO will be present to examine pilot and balloon documents. Be sure you have a current balloon registration.

## Corporate Balloons

Spots are available for Corporate Balloons wishing to participate during the week or during the weekend activities. If you are interested in advertising product, company, service, or identifiable artwork, logos, etc. you are welcome to participate. Commercial balloon entry fees are \$1,500 and are payable to the BFA. If you have associated merchandise you would like to offer for sale you need to contact Colleen Johnson at Old West Balloon Fest directly (colleenjohnson302@gmail.com) for booth information, pricing and availability.

#### Room Accommodations

The Organizer is working on hotel arrangements trying their very best to provide suitable accommodations for pilots and crew as convenient as possible to the briefing center. Economics, of course, plays a major role in finding suitable facilities. Pilots will be advised of hotel choices available upon acceptance into the Championship and the **hotel selection process will be based on a first-come, first-served basis determined by pilot application entry date.** Pilots will be required to make their own reservations for early arrivals and crew rooms once advised of contracted hotels. Please do not contact any hotels directly for early arrival or crew rooms until notified through your acceptance email.

#### Social Events

Five (5) complimentary tickets will be provided to each pilot for themselves and crew for each of our continental breakfasts and evening socials. Meals included are Sunday BBQ Volunteer and Pilot Meet & Greet, Friday Pilot/Sponsor Dinner and Sunday Awards Brunch.

#### **Volunteer Crew**

We will make every effort to provide local crew should you need such. Please indicate on the Pilot Application the number of crew members you would like us to provide for each scheduled flight.

If you are provided local crew, we ask that you provide them with the complimentary meal tickets that are given to you or purchase additional tickets as needed. If your plans or needs change, we ask that you notify the volunteer coordinator immediately so that the volunteers can be reassigned. Our volunteer coordinator is Sherri Cargile and her contact information will be made available in your acceptance confirmation package.

## Maps

Each participating pilot is provided two official full color competition maps of the primary competition area. Once finalized, you will be provided a link to digital versions (several file formats) of the competition map.

Map development will be available for viewing thru its finalization using this link: <u>US National Map Drop Box</u>. Maps will be available for mailing to pilots in advance should you choose. Exact cost of postage and handling is not currently known but will probably approximate \$10. This information will be made available when the approved pilot list is finalized.

## Airspace

A portion of competitive flight operations are within the Class E airspace of Western Nebraska Regional Airport (KBFF). The facility is fully cooperating with our event and operations personnel to ensure a safe event. No ATC clearance or radio communication is required for VFR flight in class E airspace.

## **FSIMS Implications**

The FAA issued Order 8900.1 effective January 1, 2019. The Order clarified many issues facing balloon events and pilots related to compensation for hire, aircraft lights for night glows and required pilot and aircraft documents. While the language of FSIMS says the organizer is 'authorized to send' the FSDO electronic copies of the pilot and aircraft documentation 30 days or more prior to the event, we don't currently know how the Lincoln FSDO will interpret this requirement. After acceptance you will be advised if you are required to submit these documents electronically.

If you apply, I encourage you to prepare the following required documents for electronic submission no later than July 1, 2019:

Further information on rules, schedule updates, competition maps, etc. will be posted to the Official Notice Board on the BFA web site as available and applicants should check the site frequently. It is my intent to rely heavily on the BFA web site's Official Notice Board, Remind Messaging System and e-mail correspondence to keep everyone posted on current developments.

## **PILOT ENTRY AGREEMENT**

## Including Acknowledgement of Responsibility and Release of Liability

I hereby declare that I am participating in the US National Hot Air Balloon Championship (*Championship*) on August 11 - 18, 2019 of my own free volition. I agree that the organizers and sponsors of this event (including the Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Trail Foundation and Scotts Bluff County' Balloon Federation of America, event race officials, my sponsor or any subsidiaries, employees, officers, trustees, agents and/or members of the above mentioned entities) are providing me with the facilities and means for my participation in this event and in no way do they supersede the responsibility of the pilot in command, as shown in CFR § 91.3(a) and elsewhere in the Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR's).

I hereby certify that I am aware of and agree with the responsibility legally transferred to me under the Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR's) as regards my personal decision to fly my balloon, and any bodily injury or property damage resulting from there is solely my liability, and that my decision as pilot in command may affect my placement in this event if I choose not to fly. I understand that the pilot of each balloon has full and complete authority over the balloon and is responsible for all decisions to be made associated with the balloon on the ground and in the air.

I certify that I am of sound mind and body and I have no medical, mental, or physical limitations that would limit my ability to safely fly my aircraft. I am not taking prescription or over the counter drugs that may impair my ability to safely fly my aircraft.

Officials of the US National Hot Air Balloon Championship may supply information, guidance, or data and will use reasonable care to ensure the information is accurate and complete. However, the BFA/HACD and Championship assumes no responsibility for the completeness or accuracy of such information. It is my decision whether to rely on that information or acquire additional information. I agree that none of the flights are mandatory and that I will make all flights at my option.

I hereby agree to have in full force during the Championship a balloon insurance policy with minimum liability limits of \$1,000,000 each occurrence combined bodily injury and property damage, including passengers, but not less than \$100,000 each passenger.

I hereby give permission, without any restriction, to the Championship or its assigns, to use still and motion pictures and sound recordings of me, my balloon, equipment, chase crewmembers, employees and agents for news, advertising, promotional media and commercial uses.

It is my understanding that the organizers may inspect all balloons entered in the event; but that such inspection is only for the purpose of determining whether the aircraft complies with all rules of eligibility of said event. The approval of the balloon by said officials does not constitute a representation or warranty of any kind or character whatsoever concerning the mechanical condition of the aircraft, or whether or not it is airworthy.

I acknowledge that the Championship utilizes GPS loggers for purposes of scoring and monitoring participant's flights for adherence to event regulations regarding landowner relations and Prohibited Zone infractions. I agree to carry this GPS logger on all flights and conform to all rules related to its use. I also acknowledge financial responsibility for the device while under my control.

I agree that this Agreement is a Nebraska contract and it is to be governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska, and that I hereby submit myself to the jurisdiction of the Nebraska courts concerning any claims arising out of the Championship or this Agreement. This Agreement, including the Conditions of Entry, General Information, Insurance and Hotel Reservation form, contains all the terms and conditions agreed to by the parties hereto, and no other agreements or discussions, oral or written, regarding the subject matter of the Agreement shall be deemed to exist or bind any of the parties hereto.

I, the pilot in command, hereby declare that I will fly in accordance with the event rules and regulations, abide by the FAR's, and fly entirely at my own risk and waive any right of action against the Championship, the owner of the launch site, event race officials, my sponsor or any employees, officers, trustees, agents, and their respective members for any loss or damage sustained by me in consequence of any action or omission on their part, my part or the part of other participants.

Thus, I release the organizers and sponsors of this event (including the Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Trail Foundation and Scotts Bluff County, Balloon Federation of America, event race officials, my sponsor or any subsidiaries, employees, officers, trustees, agents and/or members of the above mentioned entities) from liability for their actions or inactions relating to the Championship which may arise out of or result from or in any manner be connected with the balloon flight or activity in which I participate as a pilot in command.
